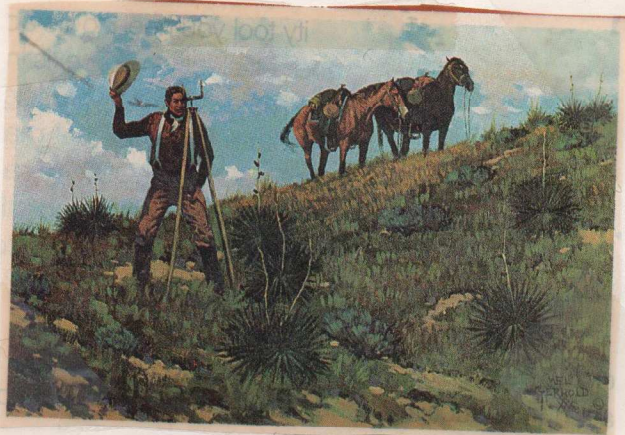

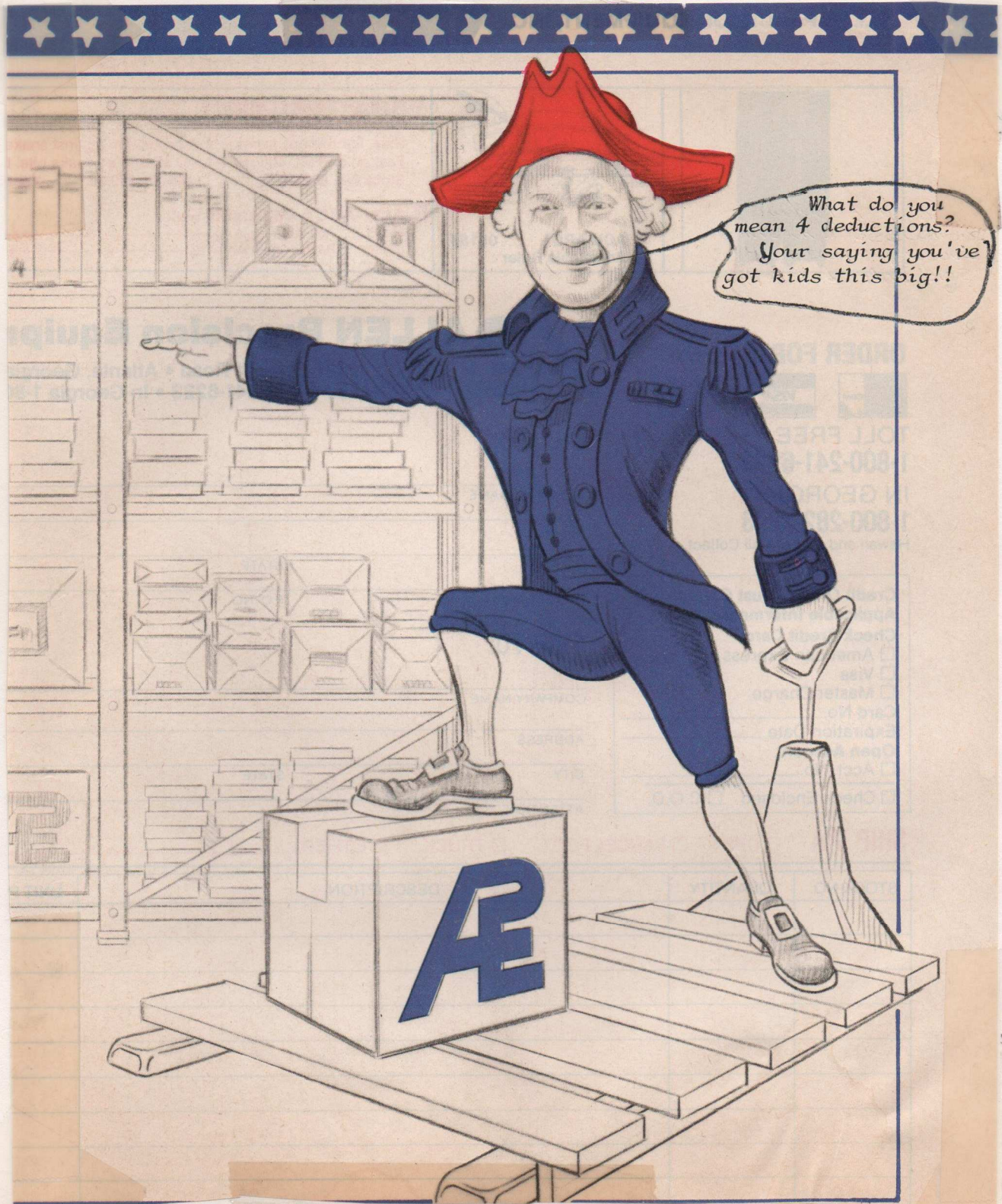

2-6. ROUNDING OFF NUMBERS. Rounding off a number is the process of dropping one or more digits so that the answer contains only those digits which are significant or necessary in subsequent computations. In rounding off numbers to any required degree of accuracy in this text, the following procedure will be observed:

1. When the digit to be dropped is less than 5, the number is written *without* the digit. Thus 78.374 becomes 78.37.
2. When the digit to be dropped is exactly 5, the nearest *even* number is used for the preceding digit. Thus 78.375 becomes 78.38, and 78.385 is also rounded to 78.38.
3. When the digit to be dropped is greater than 5, the number is written with the preceding digit *increased* by one. Thus 78.376 becomes 78.38.

The procedures in (1) and (3) are standard practice. When rounding off the value 78.375 in (2), however, some computers always take the next-higher hundredth, whereas others invariably use the next-lower hundredth. Using the nearest even digit, however, produces better balanced results in a series of computations.

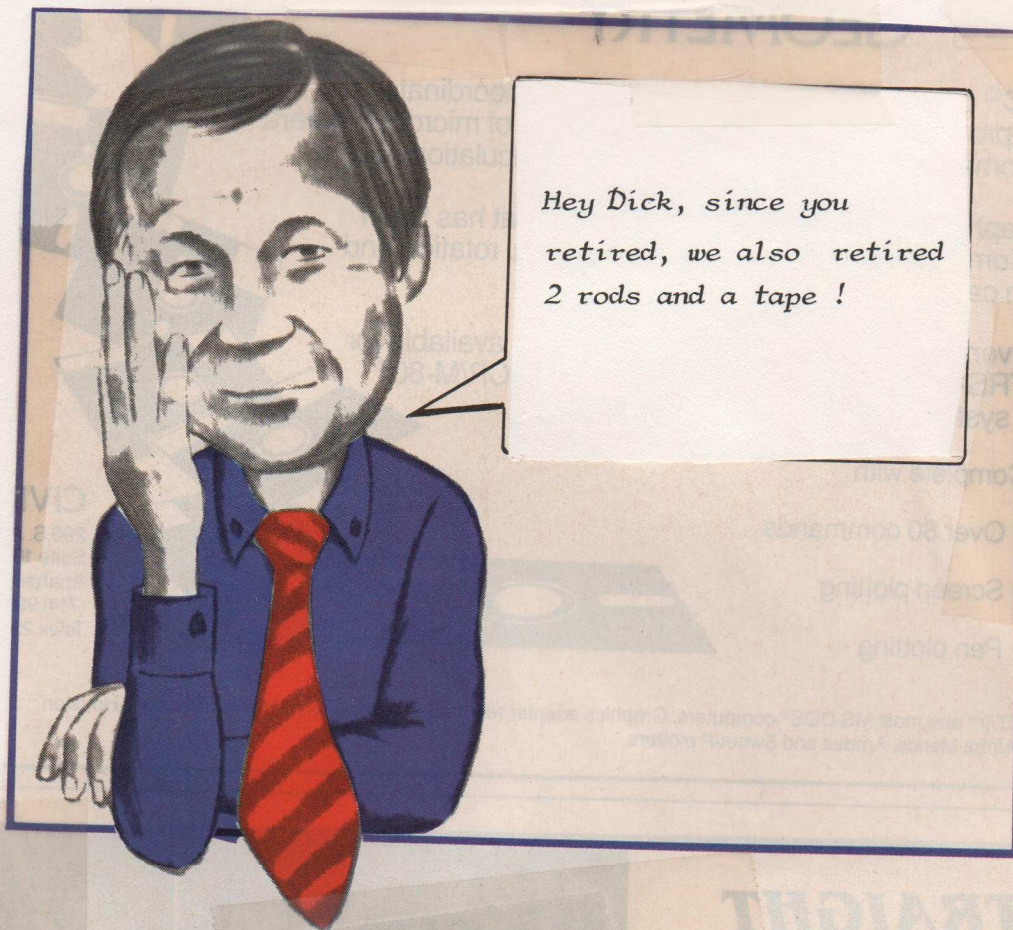
